Discharge Teaching

Initially, babies will need to feed as often and as long as the baby desires. (Observe for feeding cues like mouth open, sucking on hands or tongue etc.) Generally 8 or more feedings in 24 hrs is normal. (Pg. 21 A New Beginning Book) Infants who are breastfed adequately should have a minimum of 2-3 bowel movements when they are 2-3 days old. On day of life 4 or more, infant should have 3-4 bowel movements in 24 hours. (Pg. 24 A New Beginning Book) Breastfeeding moms should NOT experience nipple damage including bruised, cracked or bleeding on the nipple. Resources include: WIC peer counselors, SFH lactation consultations and your pediatrician. (Pg. 27 A New Beginning Book)
